Cure Kids

Red Nose Day is back – Dunlop Targa the first place red noses will be seen!

After 13 years of lying dormant, Cure Kids is bringing back Red Nose Day – bigger and better than ever before! Yes, they've seen the petitions and the requests to play the song, and so now they want to cover New Zealand in a sea of red noses. Red Nose Day will appeal to the nostalgia of earlier generations familiar with the concept (like Dunlop Targa drivers) and bring on board Kiwi kids who can get involved with something fun. Cure Kids aim to raise \$1 million throughout New Zealand for childhood medical research! With Paperplus Group as the major partner for 2010, the Red Nose Day campaign will begin on November 1st * with the official Red Nose Day to be held on Friday, November 19th. But before it all begins, there is the chance for Dunlop Targa to be the first event to sport red noses.

Car noses and “people” noses will be on sale at Dunlop Targa scrutineering on Monday 25th alongside the \$50, \$100, \$200 and \$500 car stickers. Cure Kids and Dunlop Targa's ambition is for every car and driver in the rally to have a car nose. Cure Kids will then organise media coverage of the ‘red-nosed rally’. Please come to scrutineering prepared to purchase car noses (\$5) and people noses (\$2) as well as the Cure Kids stickers. For any drivers who are keen to ask your supporters to support Cure Kids, you can do this in two ways. You can set up your own Dunlop Targa fundraiser online page at <http://www.fundraiseonline.co.nz/curekids/> (select create a new account and enter “Dunlop Targa” as the event and follow instructions – you can include photos of your car) or you can choose to set up a Red Nose Day fundraising page using the template. A special Cure Kids sticker will be made for every team who raises over \$1000 acknowledging the amount you have raised. This sticker can be displayed on your vehicle for the entire event. Cure Kids look forward to seeing you in the Dunlop Targa. Watch out for Carolyn and her co-driver Nicola Brockie in their sporty Cure Kids-branded Peugeot RCZ! You will also have a chance to meet Cure Kids Ambassadors at scrutineering, along the way and at the Finish line.

Britz Campervans

We have just concluded a new relationship with Britz NZ who are providing us with Campervans for the timing teams as well as a Media Centre Vehicle. As part of this relationship they have also offered us the opportunity for anyone associated with Targa to help relocate campervans that are in Wellington back to Auckland. There are a few conditions:

- Drivers must be over the age of 21 and hold a full valid NZ drivers license.
- Drivers are responsible for their own transportation to Wellington Wharf to collect the vehicles and then from our Auckland Airport depot upon delivering the vehicle (36 Richard Pearse Drive, Mangere, Auckland Airport).
- Vehicles need to be collected at the latest by 5pm Saturday 30th October but are available earlier during the hours of 9am and 5pm.
- While this is **not** paid employment, drivers will receive a one off per diem allowance payment of \$70 for relocating the vehicle which will be paid upon return of the vehicle in Auckland, and additional fuel needed for the vehicle will be re-imbursed upon check-in of the vehicle at the Auckland Airport depot upon presentation of valid GST receipts.

This is a good opportunity for anyone wanting to take a couple of days out after Targa and wind your way back to Auckland.
